Atwood, M.C.. **The Devils You Know.** Separated from their class during a class trip to the infamous Boulder House, five teens confront their darkest selves and band together to escape the terrors of a Wisconsin landmark. (YF Atwood)

Bognanni, Peter. **Things I'm Seeing Without You.** When tragedy strikes, Tess drops out of school and moves in with her funeral director dad, forcing her to examine life, death, and the boy she thought she knew and loved in a brand new light. (YF Bognan)

Bray, Libba. **Before the Devil Breaks You.** The Diviners face ghosts that are haunting an asylum and wreaking havoc all over New York City, forgotten ones with dangerous ties to the King of Crows. (YF Bray)

Brewer, Zac. **Madness.** Released from an inpatient facility after treatment for a suicide attempt, Brooke gradually begins to see hope in her life and meets Derek, a fellow suicide survivor, but as she falls for him, she realizes that Derek may not be in the same mental space she is. (YF Brewer)

Cameron, Sharon. **The Knowing.** The underground city of New Canaan is safe from the Forgetting which afflicts Canaan above ground, but in her rigidly controlled and repressive city eighteen-year-old Samara, one of the Knowing, is plagued by her memory of the horrors she has seen, and determined to seek answers in the cursed city above. Carter, Ally. **Not if I Save You First.** Six years ago Maddie lived in Washington D.C. with her father, a Secret Service agent assigned to the President's family, and her best friend was Logan, the President's son. After her father was wounded in an attempted kidnapping the two of them moved to a remote cabin in Alaska and Logan never replied to her letters—but why has he now suddenly turned up on her doorstep? (YF Carter) Demetrios, Heather. **Bad Romance.** When Grace and Gavin fall in love, Grace is sure it's too good to be true. She has no idea their relationship will become a prison she's unable to escape. (YF Demetr)

Flinn, Alex. **Beheld.** Being a powerful witch, Kendra has survived it all. Kendra has tangled with witch hunters and wolves, helped a miller's daughter spin straw into gold, cowered in London as German bombs fell, and lived through who knows how many shipwrecks. When a fateful accident draws these three strangers together, their secrets start to unravel as they begin to understand that the way out of their own loss might just lie in helping others out of theirs. Gray, Claudia. **Ten Thousand Skies Above You.** As eighteen-yearold Marguerite struggles to get to the heart of the corrupt company that almost killed her father, she tries to save the boy she loves, whose soul is scattered in various dimensions. (YF Gray)

Griffin, Adele. **Be True To Me.** Told in two voices, Jean, a rich girl, and Fritz, an outsider, compete for the affection of handsome newcomer Gil during the summer of 1976 at an exclusive Fire Island enclave, and discover their competition has higher stakes than either can imagine. (YF Griffi)

Hutchinson, Shaun David **The Apocalypse of Elena Mendoza**. Elena, the first scientifically confirmed virgin birth, acquires the ability to heal by touch at age sixteen, the same year that people start disappearing in beams of light, causing her to wonder if she is bringing about the Apocalypse. (YF Hutchi) Jackson, Tiffany D. **Allegedly.** When Mary, a teenager living in a group home, becomes pregnant, authorities take another look at the crime for which Mary was convicted when she was nine years old. Oakes, Stephanie. **The Arsonist.** Molly Mavity and Pepper Yusef are dealing with their own personal tragedies when they are tasked by an anonymous person with solving the decades old murder of Ava Dryman, an East German teen whose diary was published after her death. (YF Oakes)

Oseman, Alice. **Radio Silence.** What if everything you set yourself up to be was wrong? Frances has always been a study machine with one goal, elite university. Nothing will stand in her way—not friends, not a guilty secret, not even the person she is on the inside.
