OBITUARY DIGITAL INDEX LIST

Through the efforts of the Chapin Library staff, and volunteers from the Grand Strand Genealogy Club, a digital list of obituaries, that have appeared in the local Horry County newspapers from 1871 to 2016 has been completed. Said list consists of 26 binders for the years 1960-2013 and a total of approximately 165,000 individual names, from 10 different newspapers that have operated in Horry County. The digital lists are arranged in alphabetical order, date order, and newspaper order. Said project has been a work in progress for over ten years, and is now available in-house on the public computers at Chapin Library.

Previously an alphabetical list was prepared by Kathryn Lewis that covered the years 1871 to 1914. To make the material useful for computer purposes the following work had to be done:

- 1. Determine the newspapers that operated in Horry County and get copies of all publications.
- 2. Scan the pages of every newspaper for future reference
- Search every page of the newspapers and make photo copies of pages that contained an obituary.
- From the copied obituaries, type into a database the name of deceased, date of death, date of newspaper, and name of newspaper.
- 5. Collate the typed material and enter into computer digital format.
- 6. Sort the material and print binders

The project originally was started by reference library staff, and since 2007 has been headed up by reference assistant, Laura Fazekas, with help from Charlene Carson, Lesta Hardee, and Glenda Kroos. Volunteer work was principally carried out by several work interns and Grand Strand Genealogy club members: Lynda Carrigan, Joyce Emma, Dennis Fitzgerald, and Darla Williams.

Chapin Library is the only library that has the Obituary Digital List Index. In addition, Chapin Library has microfilm copies of Horry County newspapers for the period of 1871-2017 less the time period of June 1939 - June 1949, and is the only known library to have a complete set of microfilm copies of The Sun News, principal newspaper of the area.

Digital copies of The Sun News, Carolina Forest Chronicle, Myrtle Beach Herald, and The Horry Independent for the years 2017 to present are available from the public computers at the library. The library has also added the Charleston Post & Courier - Myrtle Beach/ Georgetown weekly edition since it began in 2021, to the digital archives.

Work will continue to scan and digitize newspapers from 2016 forward, but individual obituaries will not be added to the database, as the insertion of obituaries in newspapers has decreased significantly since the fees for printing such have increased.

Access to the printed binders is available on the second floor of Chapin Library in the Genealogy room.
